



THIS IS AN EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE ALBERT EDWARD
LODGE MEETING

HELD AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, LONDON ROAD CAMBERLEY

ON APRIL 23rd 1913.

PRESENT WERE: 11 Officers including W/M W/Bro. W.E Matthews

Members: 14

Visitors: 1

The Lodge was opened in due form after solemn prayer at 5.30 p.m.

The W/M then called upon the secretary to read the dispensation from Prov. Grand Master authorizing the alteration of date of meeting. This having been done, the minutes of the last regular lodge were then read and confirmed by the Brethren present.

A ballot was next taken on behalf of Mr. Thomas Goddard who had been duly proposed and seconded as a fit and proper person to become a Freemason. At its conclusion this was found to be unanimous in his favour.

Mr. Thomas Goddard was then introduced to the Lodge as the candidate properly prepared to be made a Mason and was duly initiated into the Ancient Mysteries and Privileges of the Order. The ceremony of initiation being ably rendered by the W/M W. Bro. W.E. Matthews.

The newly made Brother then received the charge of this Degree, the same being ably rendered by Bro. J.J. Appleton. J.W. The newly made Brother then retired.

Brother Edwin George Steeden was then called to the P. and after having given proof of his progress in the science was then entrusted with the P.G. and P.W. leading from the 1st to the 2nd Degree. The Brother then retired to be prepared for the ceremony.

The Lodge was then advanced to the 2nd. Degree when Bro. Steeden was re-admitted and passed to the Degree of F.C. The ceremony being ably rendered by the W/M W/Bro. W.E. Matthews. The F.C. then retired.

Bro. J.C. Lanysdale was then called to the P. and after having given proof of his progress in the Science was then entrusted with the P.G. and P.W. leading from the 2nd. to the 3rd Degree. He then retired to be prepared for the ceremony.

The Lodge then proceeded from Labour to refreshment.

The Brethren, having resumed from refreshment to Labour, W. Bro. Ellis then assumed the G. and the Lodge was opened in the 3rd. Degree and Bro. J.C. Lanysdale re-admitted and raised to the sublime Degree of a M.M. The ceremony of raising being impressively rendered by W. Bro. Ellis P.M.

The W/M then resumed the G. and the Lodge was lowered to the 1st. Degree.
