



THIS IS AN EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE ALBERT EDWARD  
LODGE MEETING

HELD AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, LONDON ROAD CAMBERLEY

ON OCTOBER 29<sup>th</sup> 1913

The Lodge was opened in due form after solemn prayer at 5.50 p.m.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and confirmed by the Brethren present.

A ballot was then taken for Mr. Ernest Hugh Foster and Mr. Arthur Jeffrey Smithers who had been proposed and seconded as fit and proper persons to become Freemasons and at the conclusion of the ballot it was found to be unanimous in their favour.

Mr. Ernest Hugh Foster and Mr. Arthur Jeffrey Smithers were then introduced to the Lodge as candidates properly prepared to be made Masons and were duly initiated into the Ancient Mysteries and Privileges of Freemasonry. The ceremony was performed by the W.M. W.E. Mathews.

The charge in this degree was then very ably given by W. Bro. W.E. Mathews. The entered apprentices having retired, the Lodge was then advanced to the 2nd. degree.

Bro. R. Mitchell was then called to the P. and after he had given proof of the progress he had made in the science was entrusted with the P.G. and P.W, leading from the 2nd to the 3rd degree. The F.C. then retired to be prepared for the ceremony.

W. Bro. W. Vaughan P.M. Chap. then assumed the gavel and the Lodge was advanced to the 3rd. degree, when Bro. R. Mitchell was re-admitted and raised to the sublime degree of a M.M. The ceremony being ably rendered by W. Bro. W. Vaughan P.M. Chap.

W. Bro. W.E. Mathews re-assumed the gavel and the Lodge was lowered to the 1st. Degree, when the E.A. were re-admitted.

The Secretary then reported that the two following Brethren were over 3 Years in arrears of Lodge dues:

The W.M. then proposed and W.Bro. Dr. Twort seconded that their names be struck off the roll of membership of this Lodge.
