

THIS IS AN EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE ALBERT EDWARD LODGE
MEETING HELD AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, LONDON ROAD, CAMBERLEY
ON WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 26th 1913

PRESENT WERE: 11 Officers, including W/M W/Bro. W.E. Matthews

MEMBERS: 10

VISITORS: 2

The Lodge was opened in due form after solemn prayer at 6.30 p.m.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and confirmed by the Brethren present.

A ballot was next taken on behalf of Mr. John Clifton Lanysdale who had been duly proposed and seconded as a fit and proper person to become a Freemason. At its conclusion it was found to be unanimous in his favour.

Mr. John Clifton Lanysdale was then introduced to the Lodge as the candidate properly prepared to be made a Mason and was then duly initiated into the Ancient Mysteries and Privileges of the order. The ceremony on initiation being ably rendered by the W.M. (W/Bro. W.E. Matthews) who also delivered the Charge of the 1st. Deg. to the newly made Bro.

W. Bro. W.N. Twort. P.M..P.J.G.D, treasurer, then gave an explanation of the 1st degree tracing board in his usual masterly style.

The W.M. then presented Grand Lodge Certificates to Bro. J.M. Kenning and Bro. J. Meiklejohn

The Secretary reported that no replies had been received from W. Bro. J. Mee, Bros. W.S. Towers, P.M. Haffenden and J. Hill , with reference to their arrears of Lodge dues. The notice of seven days having been given in accordance with rule 210 Book of Constitution, W. Bro. W.J. Burn proposed and W. Bro. Dr. W.N. Twort seconded , that the names of Bros. Mee, Towers, Haffenden and Hill be erased from the Roll of Membership.

This proposition on being put to the Lodge was carried unanimously.

The following candidate was then proposed as a fit and proper person to be made a Mason: Mr. Edwin George Steeden

Proposed by Bro. R. King, Secretary. Seconded by W. Bro. W.E. Matthews, W.M.

Apologies for non-attendance were received from several Brethren

Nothing further being offered for Freemasonry in General or this Lodge in particular, it was closed in perfect harmony at 8.05 p.m.
