

This is an extract from the minutes of the Albert Edward Lodge meeting held at the Municipal Building, London Road, Camberley on Thursday January 27th 1910

Present were:- 13 Officers including W.M. W. Bro. Burn

15 Members and 21 guests

The lodge was opened in due form after Solemn prayer at 5.20 p.m.

The W.M. then called upon the Secretary to read the Dispensation from the RW Prov. Grand Master authorizing the meeting. This done, the minutes of the last regular meeting were then read and confirmed.

The lodge was then advanced to the 2nd. degree and Bro. Richard Shepherd S.W. and W.M. Elect was then introduced by the D.C. to the installing Master (W. Bro. Burn) for favour of installation

The ancient charges were then read by the secretary to Bro. Shepherd to all of which he signified assent.

The lodge was then advanced to the 3rd Degree and all brethren below the rank of an installed master retired.

Bro. Shepherd was then duly installed into the chair of K.S. according to ancient custom.

The installed master having invested his I.P.M. the brethren were re-admitted and under the direction of the D.C. then saluted the W.M. in the 3 degrees.

The W.M. then invested his officers for the ensuing year.

The following members were then unanimously elected to serve on the Ref. Committee for the ensuing year (Bros. Collins, Tucker and Walker)

Next W.Bro.. Kennett was unanimously elected as Charity Representative of the Lodge. W.Bro. Kennett thanked the brethren for the honour conferred.

The W.M./ then presented to W.Bro. Burn I.P.M. with a past masters jewel at the same time paying him a high tribute on the very efficient manner he had carried out his duties while W.M. of the lodge. W.Bro. Burn then thanked the W.M. and the brethren for their appreciation of his services as W.M. The presentation was to him a proof that he had done his duties to the satisfaction of the brethren

The lodge was then lowered to the 1st degree and greetings were given to the W.M. from the visiting brethren The secretary then informed the lodge that Bros. A. Blake and G. Paxman had resigned.

The charity box realized £ 1. 11sh. 4pence (in todays money approx. £ 117)

Several apologies for non-attendance were received. Nothing further being offered for the good of Freemasonry in general or this lodge in particular it was closed in due form at 6.45. p.m..
