

THIS AN EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE ALBERT EDWARD LODGE 1714  
MEETING HELD AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS LONDON ROAD CAMBERLEY ON  
WEDNESDAY JANUARY 29th 1913

PRESENT WERE: 14 Officers including W/M W/Bro. Gamble

MEMBERS: 18

VISITORS: 22

The lodge was opened in due form after solemn prayer at 4.50 p.m.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and confirmed by the Brethren present.

The lodge was then advanced to the 2nd. degree when W.Bro. W. Vaughan assumed the gavel and Bro. William Matthews S.W. was then introduced by the D. of C. to the installing master for favour of installation.

The ancient charges were then read by the Secretary to Bro. Matthews, to all of which he signified assent

The lodge was then advanced to the 3rd. degree and all Brethren below the rank of installed masters retired and Bro. Matthews was then duly installed into the chair of K.S. according to ancient custom.

The newly installed master having invested his I.P.M. the Brethren were re-admitted and under the direction of the D.of C. they saluted the W.M. in the three degrees.

The W.M. then invested his officers for the ensuing year.

The following members were then unanimously elected to serve on the reference committee for the ensuing year. Bros. Stallwood, Hedges, Moss. Bro. Hedges also acted as Almoner

A charity representative was then elected and on the proposition of W. Bro. Burn, seconded by W. Bro. Tew, W. Bro. A.M. Kennett P.M. was unanimously elected. W.Bro. Kennett then thanked the Brethren for the honour & confidence thus conferred on him.

The W.M. then presented W.Bro. Gamble I.P.M. - on behalf of the lodge - a P.M. Jewel, paying him at the same time a high tribute on the efficient manner he had carried out his duties as W.M. of the lodge. W.Bro. Gamble then thanked the Brethren for their appreciation of his services.

The W.M. then presented to W.Bro. Baskett P.M. D.C. - on behalf of the lodge - a D. of C. Jewel as a token of appreciation of his services as D. of C. for the past six years. W.Bro. Baskett in suitable terms then thanked the Brethren.

The following candidate was then proposed as a fit & proper person to become a Mason:- John Clifton Lanysdale, aged 47, Boot & Leather Merchant, London Road, Yorktown.

Proposed by Bro. W. N. Blackaby J.W. seconded by W.Bro. Vaughan P.M. Chp.

Under the direction of the D of C greetings were then given by the visiting Brethren to the W.M.

Letters of apology were read from several Brethren.

All business being ended, the lodge was then closed in perfect harmony at 6.40 p.m.
