

THIS IS AN EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF THE ALBERT EDWARD LODGE
MEETING HELD AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, LONDON ROAD, CAMBERLEY
ON WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 25th. 1910.

Present were: 10 Officers including W/M W/Bro. R. Shepherd

6 Members

The lodge was opened in due form, after solemn prayer, at 6.20 p.m.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and confirmed.

A ballot was next taken for Mr. Thomas Edward Hogben who had been regularly proposed and seconded as a fit and proper person to be made a Freemason and at the conclusion of the ballot it was found to be unanimous in his favour.

The candidate was then introduced to the Lodge, properly prepared to be made a Mason and was then duly initiated into the Ancient mysteries and privileges of Freemasonry. The ceremony being ably rendered by the W.M. W. Bro. R. Shepherd. The newly made Bro. then retired and on his re-admission to the Lodge he received the Charge of the 1st. degree, the same being given by the S.W. Bro. W. Vaughan in an impressive manner. The E.A. then retired.

The Secretary then read a letter from the Asst. Prov. Gd. Master asking for the Lodges assistance towards a " League of Mercy " of which Lady Bucknill is the Secretary. The following proposition was then put : " that the Albert Edward Lodge subscribe 2 guineas towards this deserving fund. " proposed by Bro. R.J. Owen seconded by Bro. J.J. Appleton - carried unanimously.
